Missionaries of the Month: The Gary & Rachel de León family

Over the next few weeks, we will be hearing updates and prayer requests from the de León family. Here is more information on Gary and Rachel's new mission, Project Milkat: "We have learned so much about the refugee community that it almost feels like we have been here much longer than a year! They have shared with us the challenges they faced along their journey to get to Spain, the memories they still have of their home countries, their loved ones they left behind and so much more. We have the wonderful opportunity to share God's love to many people of various nationalities and cultures that we wouldn't have otherwise. It's truly a wonderful experience to serve where God has placed us and have the opportunity to learn from these families and be reminded of values that we often take for granted." Project Milkat has over 28 nationalities represented and processes approximately 615 asylum seekers each month! Donations for their mission will be collected during the next four weeks of December.

Foundry class: Biblical Interpretation – Have you ever found that the Bible is sometimes a bit strange? Confusing? Hard to understand? Branson will be teaching a course on Biblical Interpretation for the Alliance of Reformed Churches cohort that meets at Community Reformed Church in Zeeland. This course walks through foundational principles of interpreting the Bible, outlines a Reformed doctrine of Scripture, and examines how we can faithfully apply and live out Scripture today.
